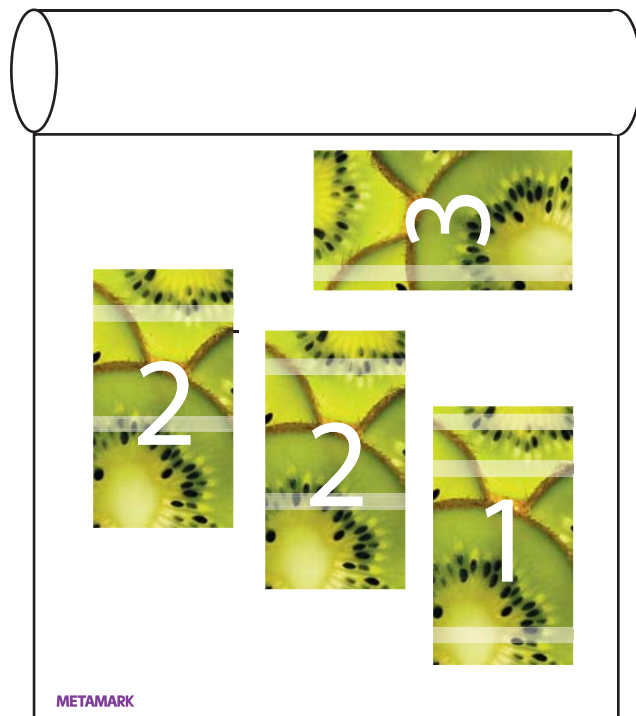


Crop and Print Image

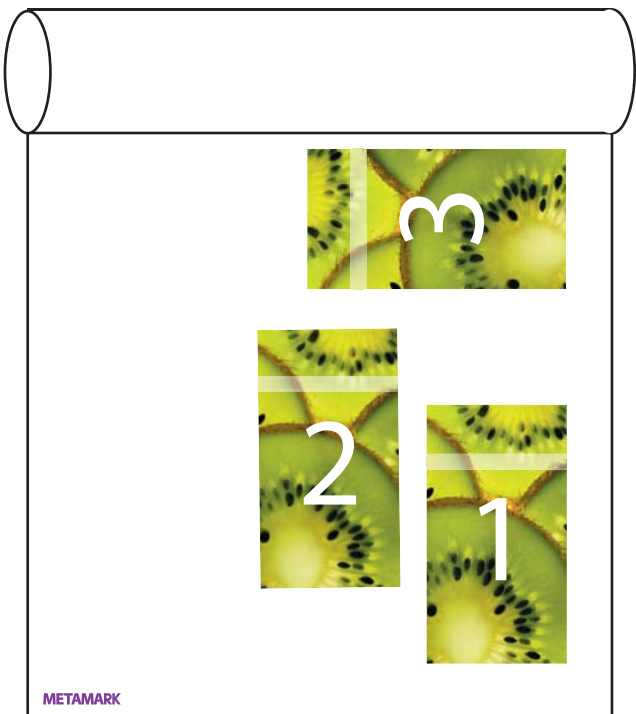
1. Crop and print the Image (1) approx 200mm x 500mm, close to the problematic edge of the roll. Repeat again if banding does not appear.
2. Start a repeat print again (2) this time 100mm into the roll, to the left. Repeat if necessary until banding shows.



Cause: - Printer issue

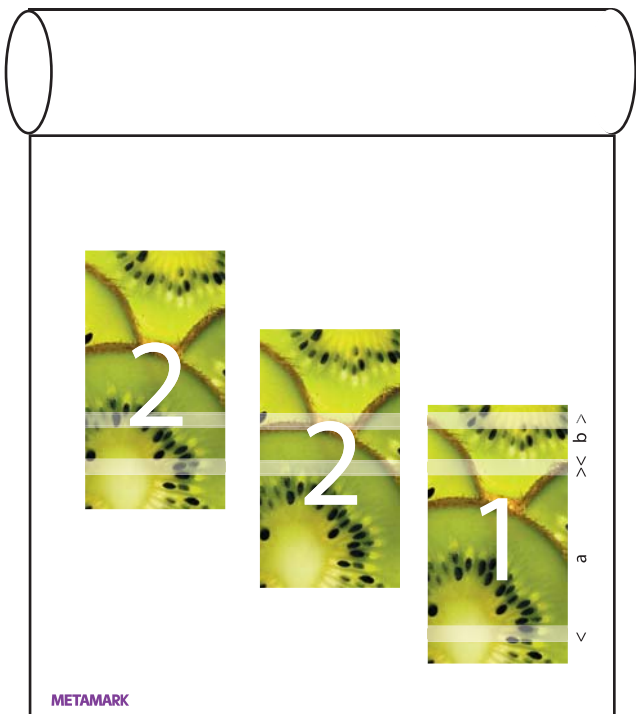
If the bands appear in a different place on the roll on each print as shown here then it is a printer issue or an image issue.

Print the same image rotated 90°, to the right of the roll (3). Check where banding appears. If it hasn't rotated as shown then it a printer issue.



Cause: - Image issue

If when rotating the image (3) the band has also rotated then it is in the image - the band will appear in the same place in each image.



Cause: - Media or handling issue

If banding appears in the same place on the roll on both prints as shown here then it is handling or media.

A) Handling issue - compare spacing on the prints (shown by 'a and b') with circumference of roll / spacing of unwind rollers.

B) Media Issue - If the bands are not spaced as above then it is a coating issue. You can double check by cutting 1m off the roll and turn 90° then feed again
